High School vs. Junior High School

- Our day begins early, but it finishes earlier as well - 7:15 - 2:35
- You now officially earn credit in high school
 - 26 credits required for graduation / 6 credits to become a Sophomore
 - Courses not passed must be retaken in Summer School or following school year
- Attendance COUNTS! **90% Attendance**
- Must pass five STAAR tests in order to graduate.

THREE are taken in 9th grade: English I, Algebra I, and Biology

NEXT YEAR SCHEDULE

- ▶ Next year, CHS will be transitioning to an 8 period day block schedule
- ▶ Students will attend 4 classes on "Gold Day" and their other 4 classes on "White Day"
- ▶ Example of the schedule:

DOUBLE BLOCK CLASSES
